



e-LEARNING for HEALTHCARE (e-LfH) registration information for STIF Foundation course attendees

The estimated time to complete the sessions is 8 – 12 hours depending on knowledge and experience.

To get the maximum benefit from the workshops provided by the STIF and STIF-PLUS days it is highly recommended that delegates study the appropriate e-learning sessions before attending. Once NHS users have registered for e-learning, there is no expiry time on the account.

PLEASE ENSURE YOU REGISTER FOR THE CORRECT PROJECT WHICH IS CALLED: e-Learning for Sexual Health & HIV (eHIV-STI).

There is another project with a similar name (e-SRH: Sexual and Reproductive Healthcare) developed by the Faculty of Sexual and Reproductive Healthcare which focuses mainly on contraceptive issues and does not contain the sessions required for the STIF course.

e-Learning for Sexual Health & HIV (eHIV-STI)

eHIV-STI is accessible in a number of ways depending on your professional role (see below).

e-LfH registration information

This is comprised of two sections:

- 1. e-LfH registration and access**
- 2. e-LfH support tools for problem solving – if you encounter problems please use the support tools before contacting the e-LfH support team.**

SECTION1: e-LfH registration and access

If you are employed by the NHS in the UK and have a NHS email address you can register for free access to eHIV-STI via the e-LfH Hub by completing the registration form on the e-LfH website:

Please note that NHS email addresses include @nhs.net, @trustname.nhs.uk and the equivalent in Scotland, N Ireland and Wales.

All NHS employees can have a NHS email address. It is understood that many nurses, practice nurses, healthcare assistants and health advisors are not routinely provided with this information. If this is the case, you need to contact your practice manager or NHS manager for your NHS email address.

- A. Doctors (including GPs) and practice nurses, working in the NHS (new e-LfH users)
- B. Existing e-LfH users
- C. Healthcare staff in NHS organisations in England signed up to the National Learning Management System (NLMS)
- D. Healthcare staff in NHS organisations in England *NOT* signed up to the NLMS
- E. Other non-NHS staff

A. Doctors (including GPs) and practice nurses working in the NHS (new e-LfH users)

If you are in this group you should complete the registration form on the e-LfH website:

You will receive access immediately.

Once you are logged in to the e-LfH Hub, please access the HIV-STI Learning Path: STIF Course to complete all recommended eHIV-STI sessions – see below.

B. Existing e-LfH users

If you already have an account with e-LfH and wish to gain access to eHIV-STI, please do not register again. Log in to the e-LfH Hub using your existing username and password, select the 'My Account' menu option and then 'Enrolment'. Programmes and applications you currently have access to will already be ticked. Select Sexual Health & HIV (HIV-STI), then select the 'Save Changes' button (at the bottom of the list) to save your selection. The programme will be available in to you instantly within the My e-Learning menu.

C. Healthcare staff in NHS organisations in England signed up to the National Learning Management System (NLMS)

If you are NHS healthcare staff in England and have access to the National Learning Management System (NLMS), you can access eHIV-STI via the NLMS as your learning is recorded against your Electronic Staff Record (ESR).

The NLMS is an e-learning platform fully integrated with the ESR which means learning can be recorded against your portable employee record. If you wish to access via the NLMS, you should speak to your local learning and development department or click the link below.
